Start with the little daily annoyances that we experience, the unkind word or hateful glance we receive. Instead of plotting revenge on that person, try saying a quick prayer for that person. **DAILY MASS DURING LENT:** The Cathedral will have daily Mass, Monday to Friday at 12:10 P.M. during Lent. In addition, Sacred Heart will have Mass on Tuesdays and Thursdays at 4:00 P.M. and Fridays at 7:00 P.M. during Lent. This year, **ASH WEDNESDAY** is on March 5<sup>th</sup>. On that day, there will be Mass at 12:10 P.M. at the Cathedral and 7:00 P.M. at Sacred Heart Parish.



**COUNTDOWN TO LENT:** Both Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are universal days of fasting and abstinence from meat. Christian fasting obtains its full meaning when we deprive ourselves of food in order to be more open to prayer, to share more in the suffering of those who are starving and to save

more for the poor (e.g. Development and Peace Campaign). To fast means to limit ourselves to one full meal and two smaller meals with nothing in between the course of the day.

The law of abstinence from meat binds all those who are 14 and older. The law of fasting binds those from 18 to 59 years of age. However, it is recommended that children should be gradually introduced to the understanding and practice of this form of penance.

What about Fridays? Fridays have always been considered a day of special penance, a day on which we should respond more seriously to Jesus' command to carry our cross and follow Him. According to the precepts of the Church, Fridays are still days of fasting and abstinence (except during the Easter Season). The Code of Canon Law states: "The days and times of penance for the Universal Church are each Friday of the whole year and the season of Lent (1250). As well, "abstinence from meat . . . is to be observed in all Fridays, unless a solemnity should fall on Friday (1251).

After Vatican II, the Bishops of Canada did give permission for Catholic to substitute fasting and abstinence with another form of penance or an act of charity. However, over the years many of us have forgotten about this and many today do not fast, abstain or substitute an act of charity of penance. Perhaps this is an area that we can all work on this Lent and continue the practice throughout the year on Fridays.

**STATIONS OF THE CROSS:** Each Friday during the Season of Lent, Mass will be celebrated at Sacred Heart Parish at 7:00 P.M. followed by praying the Stations of the Cross. This is a beautiful Lenten devotion and a great way to enter into this sacred season. As well, St. Anthony's will have the Stations of the Cross on Thursdays after the 12:10 P.M. Mass.
